Humanitarian Assistance

Overview:

- *DoD Conducts Humanitarian Assistance (HA) to relieve or reduce endemic conditions such as human suffering, disease, hunger, privation, and the adverse effects of unexploded ordnance (UXO), particularly in regions where humanitarian needs may pose major challenges to stability, prosperity, and respect for universal human values.*

Programs:

- The **Humanitarian Assistance Program** is a collaborative DoD engagement with PN government authorities to directly relieve or reduce human suffering, disease, hunger or privation or to increase PN capacity to provide essential human services to vulnerable populations. HA activities include construction, training, planning, and provision of equipment to address disaster risk reduction, mitigation, and preparedness; health-related projects and activities; basic education support; and basic infrastructure.
- The **Humanitarian Mine Action Program** provides assistance to PN civilian populations plagued by landmines, explosive remnants of war (ERW), and the hazardous effects of UXO by **developing indigenous PN capacity for humanitarian demining, land-based and underwater explosive ordnance disposal, and physical security and stockpile management (PSSM) of conventional munitions.**
- The **HA Excess Property Program** donates **non-lethal excess DoD supplies and property** for humanitarian assistance purposes.



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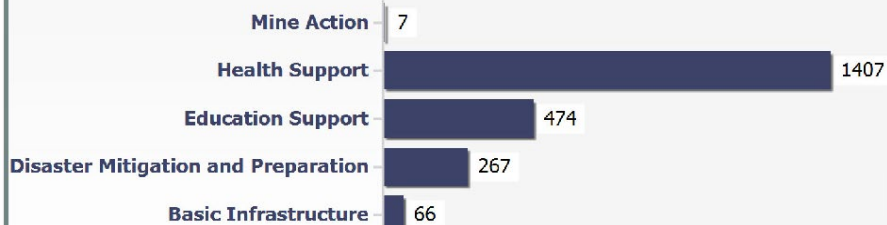

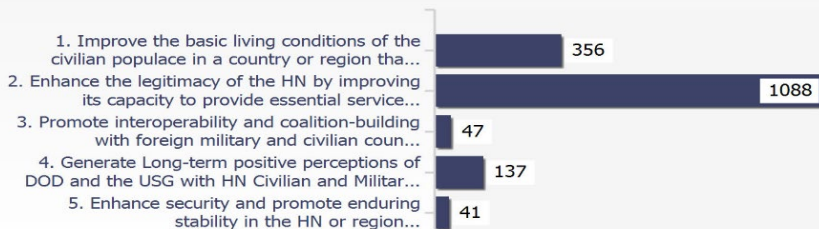
Projects by Fiscal Year

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Foreign Disaster Relief

- **We focus on supporting U.S. government efforts to reduce human suffering in the aftermath of natural disasters like hurricanes and earthquakes. The goal is to help set the stage for long-term recovery**
- **We are poised to direct U.S. military forces to help a nation in the aftermath of a disaster. Any such mission is in support of U.S. Agency for International Development's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance, which serves as the lead U.S. federal agency for foreign disaster relief efforts**
- **Support must be requested by the host nation. Under our direction, U.S. military forces support the comprehensive U.S. government disaster response approach led by USAID/BHA.**



Public Private Cooperation

- Identify, Engage, and Integrate Non-Federal Entities (NFEs) and civil society in support of SC Enterprise-wide activities in order to **Strengthen Partnerships, Counter Threats, and Build the Team**.
- Enhance the overall quality and depth of U.S. engagement in the region by integrating the unique capabilities and resources of NFEs and civil society in support of SC operations, activities, and investments.
- Execute a “Whole of Society” approach.

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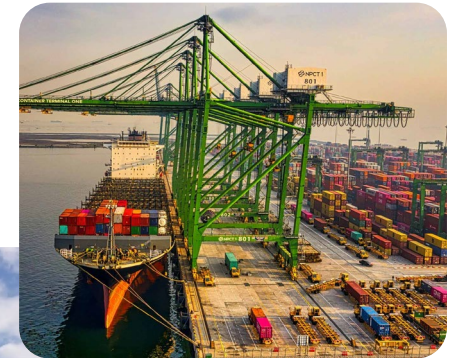




PPC GUIDANCE
