

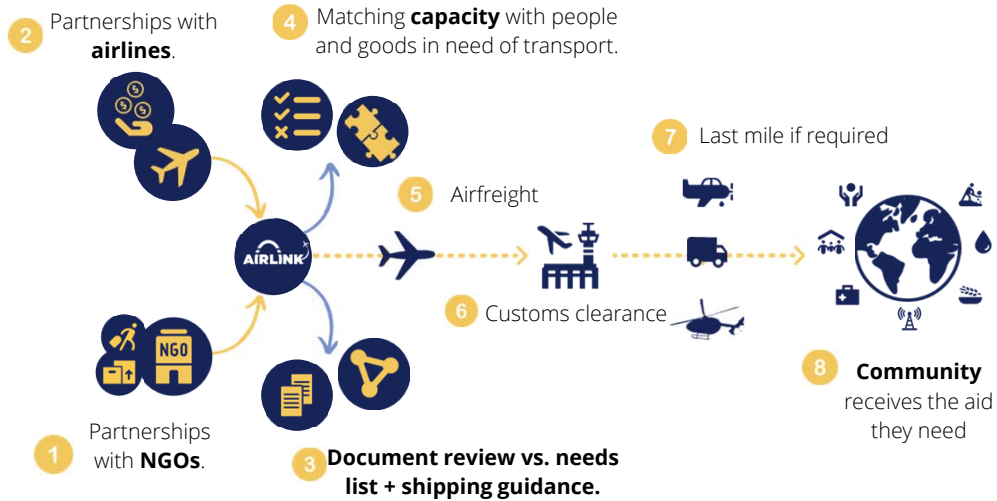

- 60% of aid sent is not needed at time it arrives
- Focus on the most impactful humanitarian organizations
- A platform for co-operation



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CHALLENGES OF HANDLING RELIEF ITEMS



- In-kind donations can be difficult to manage, sort, organize, and distribute.
- Unsolicited donations can be inappropriate, not based on needs.
- The cost of transportation can exceed the cost of the supplies.
- Relief items have an impact on the local market.



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CHALLENGES OF HANDLING RELIEF ITEMS

Bottled Water

- 20,000 pallets of bottled water in an unused runway in Ceiba, Puerto Rico after Hurricane Maria, 2017



Water Treatment System

- 8 pallets of supplies. A system can provide consistent water access for 10,000 people.



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AIRLINK'S TRIPLE BOTTOM-LINE IMPACT

- **Rapid-response** and **right-timed, right-resourced** delivery
- **Relief** for humanitarian organizations from the significant financial burden of logistics and transportation that often limit their ability to respond
- **Efficient use** of aviation assets: focus on maximizing existing capacity

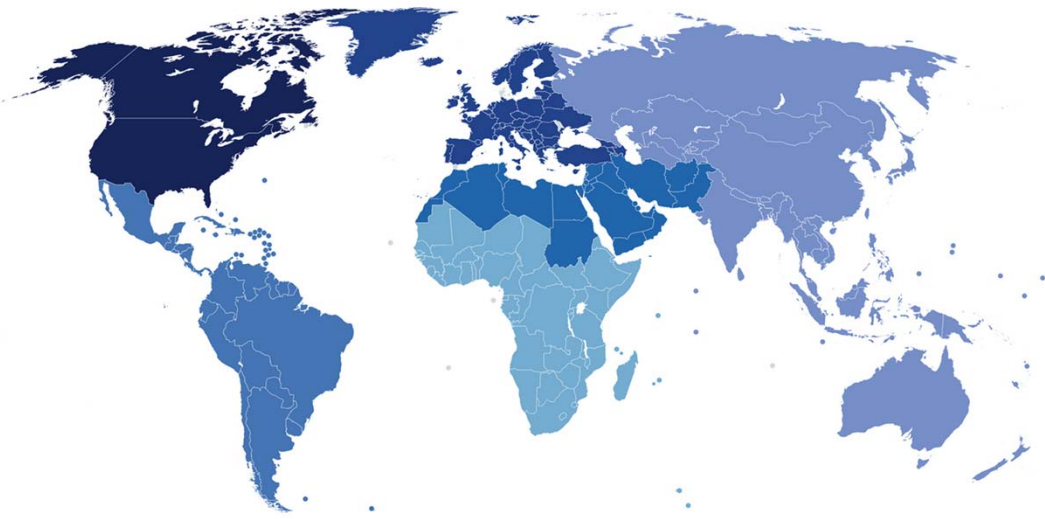


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REGIONAL RESPONSE FRAMEWORK

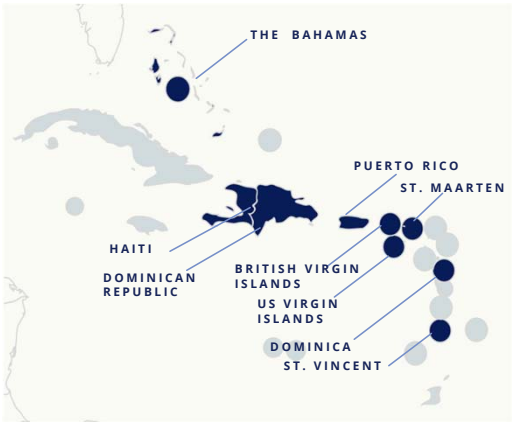

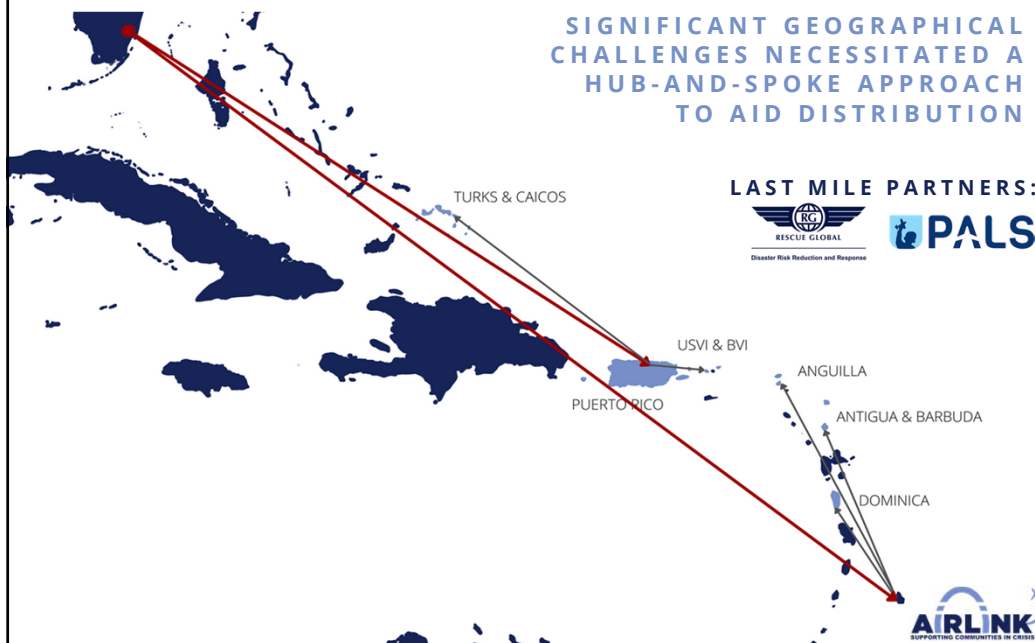

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THE ROLE OF AIRPORTS IN DISASTER RESPONSE

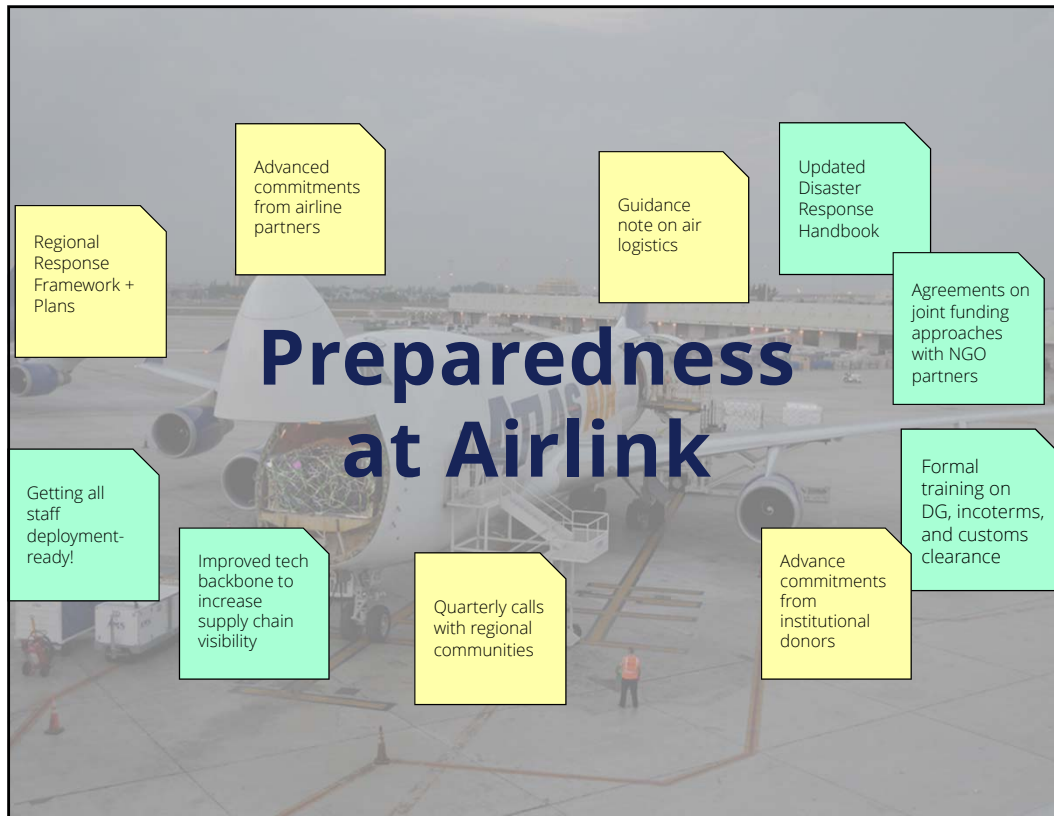
- **Assessing flight capacity to meet increased demands**
 - Factoring in the need for additional flight capacity while determining flight slots
 - Ensuring flexibility to accommodate increased humanitarian operations
- **Adequate staffing to ensure smooth flight offloading**
 - Sufficient staffing at airports for efficient offloading of relief flights
 - Streamlining processes to handle the influx of aid supplies effectively
- **Preparedness for power outages for operational continuity**
 - Developing plans to address potential power outages during disasters
 - Equipping airports with adequate offloading equipment to handle aid efficiently
